7.2. Parliament of the World's Religions

Since 1893, the Parliament of the World's Religions has been a landmark event and a major player on the world scene of international interfaith relationships. It began in 1893 at the World Columbian Exposition in Chicago, when the Exposition gave the go-ahead for an interfaith gathering. After the parliament, *Swami Vivekananda*,

the Hindu monk who spoke there, spent two years on a teaching tour, and the project to bring the world's religions together became a sort of quiet revolution spreading across the globe. There have been religious parliaments in 1893, 2013, 2015, 2018, and 2018, so far. The Parliament of the World's Religions provides a unique forum for unveiling recent research and developments in religion. The topics are varied and diverse, including religious beliefs, religious truth, faith and reason, modern science and religion, interreligious dialogue, creative non-violence, polytheism, universalism, Hinduism, spirituality, religion and the environment, religion and the law, religion and prayer, social justice, ethics and values, and theology today.¹⁹
